In the final days of Bonnie's life, Pathways staff orchestrated a poignant farewell, honoring her love for sunsets with a deeply moving gesture. As Bonnie's health declined, and with her fondness for watching the sun set from their favorite bluff in Loveland in mind, the staff wheeled her bed outside to witness one last sunset together. This heartfelt act provided Bonnie and Steven with a serene, memorable moment that perfectly captured their shared love for the beauty of the setting sun.

Bonnie, known for her vibrant spirit and zest for life, had made an indelible impression during her time at Pathways. From the moment she arrived, her energy was unmistakable. She could often be seen racing her daughter around the courtyard in a wheelchair, reflecting her love for speed and adventure. Her whimsical drawings, which still line the walls of the staff break room, served as a testament to her creativity and joy.

Bonnie and Steven's love story began in a hardware store in Grand Junction, where Bonnie managed the store. After a year of courtship, they married and built a life together, working side-by-side in Steven's HVAC business. Although Bonnie had sold her drag racing car before meeting Steven, their shared passion for racing was a cornerstone of their bond. They delighted in camping trips and created many cherished memories, often driving to their special bluff to watch the sunset.

Steven proposed to Bonnie at the end of a racetrack, with a sunset as their backdrop, declaring, "We were made for each other."

Throughout Bonnie's time at Pathways, Steven stayed by her side, deeply appreciative of the compassionate care provided by the staff. Although he had not yet used Pathways' grief support services, he valued the support of his family and



looked forward to participating in the Butterfly Release Memorial next year, a tribute to Bonnie's love for butterflies.

The shared sunset was a powerful symbol of their enduring love, and Steven, with tears in his eyes, reflected on the profound connection they had with Pathways and the beautiful memories they had created together.
